

Since its establishment in 1939, MacDill Air Force Base has been an active partner in the financial growth of the Greater Tampa Bay Area. For years aircrews have trained here for combat duty in the European Theatre of World War II, the Cold War, Korea, Vietnam/Southeast Asia, the Persian Gulf, and most recently Afghanistan/Iraq.

As world threats changed, MacDill, the home of United States Central Command (CENTCOM) and United States Special Operations Command (SOCOM), changed its focus from fighter, heavy bomber and F-16 fighter training to mobility and refueling operations in support of the unified combatant commanders. CENTCOM & SOCOM are made up of members of all services and commanded by four star flag officers.



This analysis estimates MacDill's total economic impact on the Greater Tampa Bay

Area in Fiscal Year 2010 (1 October 2009 – 30 September 2010). The impact of operations at MacDill in Fiscal Year 2010 was \$2,870,801,744, leading to an estimated 7,620 indirect jobs created in the local economy.

Military retiree households within approximately 50 miles of the base contribute an additional \$2,108,649,741, supporting an additional 23,077 indirect jobs. Combining active duty operations with the impact of the retiree population leads to a total fiscal year 2010 economic impact of \$4,979,581,485 and 30,697 indirect jobs created.

Active, reserve, guard, federal civil servants, civilian contractors, and retirees continue to enjoy being part of the Tampa Bay region. The relation between the base and surrounding communities remains solid. We look forward to this relationship continuing well into the future.
