Information & Referral

Provides assistance in determining military and community resources for referral and collaboration. It is a centralized point for information and referral to a comprehensive network of internal and external agencies, services and programs

Transition Assistance (TAP)

Workshops and services designed to prepare separating and retiring service members transition to the civilian workforce. Resume reviews, job research assistance, career planning, etc.

Employment Assistance

Offers a full range of employment assistance to Airmen and family members with job search, career development and other related services including career coaching and testing, resume writing assistance, job search assistance and executive transition workshops.

Personal & Family Readiness

Assists military members and their families through the deployment phases, by providing members with Pre/Post Deployment (Reintegration) Briefings and sustainment support to families during deployments.

Volunteer Resource Program (VRP)

Formal Department of Defense volunteer program that gives military ID card holders the chance to volunteer with agencies on MacDill AFB. Check out the list of agencies and ask about our incentive program called MacVIP.

AF Warrior & Survivor Care

The program provides transitional services to wounded, seriously ill, and injured service members.

Personal & Work Life

Offers individual consultation and programming to improve quality of life and address issues associated with personal, relational, and work matters. Some topics include, but are not limited to Key Spouse Program, Bundles for Babies and True Colors.

Air Force Families Forever (AFFF)

AFFF is a long-term survivor aftercare program established to provide support and resources to eligible surviving family members of deceased Airmen, through information and referral, as well as, facilitating remembrance and connection.

Casualty Assistance and AF Survivor Benefit Program

Provides guidance to commanders, casualty assistance representatives, family liaison officers and other support agencies to ensure members and their families are taken care of as expeditiously as possible. We also administer the Air Force's Survivor Benefit Program (SBP)

Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP)

EFMP-Family Support works directly with military and civilian organizations to provide comprehensive and coordinated community support, housing, medical, educational and personnel services to families with special needs. EFMP-FS Coordinators serve all military members from every service branch.

School Liaison Office

Offers information, assistance and referral services to parents in making their child's educational transition into and out of the area as smooth as possible. We serve as a communication link between MacDill AFB parents and the surrounding school districts and advocate for adherence to the requirements of the Interstate Compact Agreement.

Relocation Assistance

Provides the knowledge and skills needed to accomplish a successful Permanent Change of Station (PCS) and provide Newcomers Orientation.

Personal Financial Readiness (PFR)

Information, education, and counseling. PFR offers short & long-term solutions to financial problems by providing you with the information needed to develop a sound budget and plan for a strong financial future.

Emergency Financial Assistance

Provides emergency financial assistance to all branches - Air Force Aid Society (AFAS), Army Emergency Relief (AER), and the Navy Marine Corp Relief Society (NMCRS).

Military Family Life Counselor (MFLC)
