ABOUT MACDILL

Since 1939, MacDill Air Force Base has been an active partner in the financial growth of the Greater Tampa Bay Area. Aircrews have trained here for combat duty in the European Theatre of World War II, the Cold War, Korea, Vietnam, Southeast Asia, Persian Gulf, and most recently Iraq and Afghanistan. As world threats changed, MacDill has shifted its focus from fighter, heavy bomber and F-16 fighter training to mobility and refueling operations in support of the unified combatant commanders. Home to United States Central Command (USCENTCOM) and United States Special Operations Command (USSOCOM), MacDill is made up of members of all services. This analysis estimates MacDill's total economic impact on the Greater Tampa Bay Area in Fiscal Year 2023 (1 October 2022 through 30 September 2023).
