SUBJECT: Restrictions on Travel for Leave and Pass (Liberty)

- 1. To help minimize spread of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19), the following restrictions will remain in place until further notice. Per AFI 36-3003, "local area" is the location where the member lives and from which he or she commutes daily to the duty station. Unit commanders may further restrict this travel guidance as needed to meet mission requirements.
- 2. Any travel for leave or pass (e.g. weekends, holidays, non-duty days) out of the local area, but inside the state of Florida, must be approved by the member's supervisor.
- 3. Any travel for leave or pass outside the state of Florida must adhere to the following guidelines.
  - a. CONUS travel must be approved by member's Unit Commander.
  - b. OCONUS travel must be approved by the member's Group Commander or above.
- 4. Prior to approving any travel request, Units must perform a risk assessment of the health status and travel itinerary of members and ensure travel plans mitigate risk to health and mission. Units will establish a means of communication with all members throughout the period of travel.
- 5. Any 6 ARW Servicemember who fails to follow this order and its restrictions may be subject to disciplinary action under the Uniform Code of Military Justice.
