## MEMORANDUM FOR INDIVIDUALS ON MACDILL AFB

SUBJECT: Updated Guidance for Use of Masks and Other Public Health Measures

1. In accordance with Reference (a) and updated Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines, effective 28 July 2021 all Service members, Federal employees, onsite contractor employees, and visitors aged two years or older regardless of vaccination status were required to wear a mask in all indoor settings and at facilities owned, leased or otherwise controlled by DoD in areas of "substantial or high community transmission." MacDill Air Force base is in an area of high transmission as defined by the CDC. The mask mandate includes public facilities on the installation such as the Short Fitness Center and Dining Facility. Locations inside the Exchange shopping mall, shoppette, and Commissary are subject to policies set forth by AAFES and DecA, which may be more—but not less—restrictive than this guidance.

2. Commanders are authorized to make exceptions to this policy as necessary to ensure a safe workforce and safe environment in the work center.

3. Fully vaccinated personnel (at least two weeks beyond their final dose) are not required to wear masks outdoors but must continue to follow all previous indoor guidance in accordance with References (b) and (c). Personnel who are not fully vaccinated are still required to follow all previous guidance in accordance with References (b) and (c). Personnel performing official duties on behalf of the Department of the Air Force from any location, other than the individual's home, must continue to wear masks while on MacDill AFB, except (1) when an individual is alone in an office with floor-to-ceiling walls with a closed door; (2) for brief periods of time when eating and drinking while maintaining distancing in accordance with CDC guidelines and instructions from commanders and supervisors; (3) when the mask is required to be lowered briefly for identification or security purposes; (4) when necessary to reasonably accommodate an individual with a disability.

4. In addition, the following mask exceptions have been approved by the Secretary of the Air Force in accordance with Reference (c). These apply to fully vaccinated and non-vaccinated individuals while under the mask mandate: (1) when necessary to reasonably accommodate a religious belief; (2) when underlying health conditions that prohibit the wear of a face covering exist and the individual is in possession of medical documentation from a health care provider outlining such a condition; (3) when outdoors and proper physical distancing can be maintained; (4) when actively participating in physical fitness activities either indoors or outdoors and either proper physical distancing is maintained or additional measures are implemented to mitigate the threat of transmission; (5) when an individual is alone in a vehicle or is sharing the vehicle only with members of their household; (6) when use substantively interferes with the proper wear and use of personal protective equipment necessary for the accomplishment of one's military duties; (7) when personnel are in primary aircrew positions during critical phase of flight or emergencies, or when using flight crew oxygen equipment; and (8) when clear or unrestricted visualization of verbal communication are essential to safe and effective operations.

5. When inside the Short Fitness Center, all personnel will continue to wear masks during all modes of exercise except while actively utilizing cardio equipment.

6. Commanders will ensure masks worn by uniformed military members are conservative, professional, and in keeping with dignity and respect. Any cloth items worn as face coverings (i.e., neck gaiters, neck warmers, balaclavas, etc.) should be both functional and should completely cover the mouth and nose.

7. We must hold eachother accountable with this guidance in order to move back to normal as soon as possible. Unit commanders will enforce this policy to protect readiness and mission requirements. Failure to comply with this guidance may be a violation of Article 92, UCMJ, for Service members. Civilian employees who violate this guidance may be subject to adverse employment actions, while guests of the installation may potentially be barred from reentry.
